4th Sunday of Easter, Year B – 21st April 2024

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Today we reflect on the message given to us in the Gospel of John, chapter 10, verses 11-18. In this passage, Jesus proclaims, "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep." These words of Jesus highlight the selfless and

sacrificial love that our Lord has for each one of us. He is our protector, our guide, and our source of unwavering love.

As a good shepherd, Jesus knows each of us by name. He knows our joys and sorrows, our triumphs and struggles. He knows the deepest desires of our hearts and the wounds that we carry. Just as a shepherd knows his sheep, Jesus knows us intimately and loves us unconditionally.

Jesus goes on to say, "I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me." This reveals the intimate and personal relationship that Jesus desires to have with each of us. He calls us by name, and He invites us to know Him in return. As His beloved sheep, we are called to recognize His voice, to follow His guidance, and to trust in His loving care.

In this passage, Jesus also emphasizes His willingness to lay down His life for the sheep. This speaks to the ultimate sacrifice that Jesus made for us on the cross. He endured suffering and death out of love for us, so that we may have eternal life. This act

of love demonstrates the depth of God's mercy and the extent of His grace. As followers of Christ, we are called to imitate the example of the good shepherd. We

are called to show love, compassion, and selflessness towards one another. Just as Jesus laid down His life for us, we are called to lay down our lives for others in acts of service, kindness, and generosity.

Jesus goes on to say, "I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd." This reminds us that Jesus' love and salvation are not limited to a select few, but are

offered to all who are willing to hear His voice and follow Him. As members of His flock, we are called to reach out to those who have not yet heard the Good News, so that all may come to know the love of the good shepherd.

In conclusion, let us reflect on the words of Jesus in this passage and allow them to penetrate our hearts. Let us remember that we are known and loved by the good shepherd, who laid down His life for us out of love. Let us strive to follow His example of

selfless love and to share His message of hope and salvation with all we meet. May we always listen for the voice of the good shepherd, trust in His guidance, and

imitate His love in all that we do. And may we take comfort in the promise that we are held securely in the hands of the one true shepherd, who leads us on the path to eternal life. Amen.
