GOSPEL REFLECTION "Face Your Tough Choices"

One day a few years back, during a trip to Israel, I sat on the Mount of Olives, looking across the valley at Jerusalem, wondering what Jesus thought on that Palm Sunday, two thousand years ago, as he sat on the Mount of Olives. He must have known that although many people would cheer him when he entered the city, the authorities would eventually arrest him. He must have known that death waited for him across that valley. And yet, he also must have known that he couldn't live with integrity without proclaiming his message in Jerusalem, the home of religious and political leaders who had corrupted God's message of hope and peace.

Regardless, the Gospels tell us that one day, he decided to cross that valley and enter Jerusalem. You know the rest of the story. How about you? What decisions face you that call for sacrifice and courage? Do you have friends whose destructive behaviour you should challenge? Are there people at school or work you should stick up for? Are there broken relationships you're afraid to repair? Holy Week is the time to face those decisions. Watch Holy Thursday as Jesus shows you how to drop your pride and put others first. Don't miss Good Friday, where he courageously suffers and dies for what he believes. Celebrate Holy Saturday and Easter Sunday, where his Resurrection provides proof that death, violence, and fear have no ultimate power. Pray about your hard decisions as you watch Jesus make his. You'll find him walking beside you, offering the courage and wisdom you need.

Workplace Health and Safety, Maintenance and Improvements:

RECENT ACTIVITIES - assessment made of extent of repairs required to corroded church/school gutters (quote pending), measured up OSHC building for screens and roller blinds, Church Men's toilet placed out of service (leaking).

CURRENT TASKS NEEDING TO BE DONE - install security screens and roller blinds on OSHC building extension (scheduled 4th April), repair/replace damaged fence panel in church carpark, painting of presbytery gutters and eaves, removal of trees alongside boundary fence beside presbytery (roots in drains), polishing vinyl flooring in church, implement repairs to stop water leaks (wall in priest sacristy, ceiling above reconciliation facility, gutter outside toilets), renewal of Termite Management system around the church building (quote obtained). POSSIBLE FUTURE PROJECTS DEPENDING ON AVAILABILITY OF FUNDING - replace rotted-out fence posts (presbytery yard fence along side school oval), repaint inside walls of presbytery, replace/repair rusted-out gutter at chapel end of church building.
